FROM THE PASTOR

An article recommended by Pastor Andrew Packer caught my eye and I thought you might like to read some of the highlights of the article by Reverend Larry Beane titled: “**I don’t get anything out of the service.**”

He writes: A Lutheran can never say this, at least if the service is liturgical, and especially if the service includes the Most Holy Sacrament. In a liturgical setting, people will hear the Word of God. And that is always efficacious-even if it is read poorly. Traditional Lutheran hymns are also confessions of Scripture and grounded in our Lord Jesus Christ, and they also convey the Gospel-even if they are played too slowly or sung out of tune. Preaching, likewise, so long as it is the proclamation of the Word of God and not yammering on about pizza or the latest football game, is also efficacious-even if the preacher’s voice is grating, he is too loud or too soft, or is merely reading a manuscript and never looking up.

In other words, if the service is traditional Lutheran liturgy, you are getting something out of the service. And not just **something**, you are getting **everything** out of the service. You are getting forgiveness, life and salvation. You are receiving the gift of “the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.”

When people say they “don’t get anything out of the service,” they usually mean that they aren’t being entertained. And this lust for constant dopamine hits come from the world, as we are surrounded by 24-7, high-octane, on-demand visual and audio stimulation. It’s naked girls and car crashes all around. To the world, a liturgical service with preaching, hymns and Holy Communion is a staid affair by comparison.

They (our fathers in the faith) knew objectively, we get something out of the kind of worship centered on Word and Sacrament as opposed to innovations that tickle the ears of sinners obsessed with themselves and filled with hubris, believing that they know better than their fathers in the faith. Unlike church bodies from which Lutherans have imposed their non-liturgical worship forms, we authentic Lutherans confess the efficacy of Word and Sacrament, and that our justification is monergistic (we are regenerated only by the work of the Holy Spirit) rather than based on a decision on our part that can be manipulated by feelings and emotions and musical seduction. For eventually the dopamine hits fail to come, and the “exciting new way of doing church” becomes stale and boring to the self-centered soul. And like an addict, the unsatisfied ego must continue to wander, “not getting anything out of it” and looking for greater titillation elsewhere.

It is only by defiantly offering a bold alternative, something that stands apart, that we will get people-perhaps a remnant-to start realizing that when it comes to the vacuous pop culture that has come into the church like a Trojan Horse, they truly “don’t get anything out of it.”

We do get everything to of the service that is needed for our lives, especially for our eternal lives with Him as we go to a world that cannot give what He gives each and every week.

PROMISED TREASURES MATTHEW 13:52

This Lenten season, we have a fresh opportunity to embrace God’s amazing love for us, His baptized children, in new ways. St. Paul clearly says that “faith comes from hearing” (Romans 10:17), but the Gospel is also communicated through the physical senses of sight, smell, touch, and taste. Jesus mentions that a good teacher not only brings out new treasures but reminds people of old and rich treasures as well (see Matthew 13:52). So, each Wednesday in Lent, we will take a weekly journey to concretely see, smell, touch,

and taste a number of biblical elements. Our Lenten series is called Promised Treasures. Just as Israel wandered through the wilderness under Moses for forty years, awaiting the Promised Land, we await heaven in the wilderness of this life. Life as exiles in the wilderness of this world is not easy and pain-free. In this vale of tears, we await our real home, the new promised land of heaven. Until we enter our eternal promised land, however, the Lord calls us to be His light in this dark world (see Colossians 3; Ephesians 4). This series will begin with ashes, then proceed to salt, water, light, bread, and finally, palms. Then, during Holy Week, the focus shifts toward water and blood, wood, fragrant oil, and finally, on Easter, milk and honey. All these beautiful Old and New Testament elements will remind you of God's eternal love in Christ, fill you with renewed hope, and increase your joy, knowing that because we are His baptized children, God is near to us now more than ever
