FROM THE PASTOR

The Magnificat (Song of Mary)

This Lent we have been using the Vespers service. In that service we have the canticle, "The Song of Mary" or the Magnificat. I didn't know how well you would be able to sing it, as it is a little challenging but you are doing well.

In the Magnificat, it begins with "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God, my Savior". Martin Luther has a commentary on the Magnificat in which he looks at how our soul and spirit are related. You may not have known the relationship as I didn't before looking at it in volume 21 pages 299-355 (focus pg 303).

Luther points out that scripture divides man into three parts: spirit, soul and body. 1Thessalonians 5:23. He points out another division of these three and that is the whole man being divided into "Spirit" and "flesh". He says that the spirit is the highest, the deepest and noblest part of man. Which we would agree.

He then goes on to describe the relationship of soul and spirit by saying they are the same, so far as its nature is concerned but viewed in how each functions, they are different. He says the spirit gives life to the body and the soul works through the body.

In scripture, he points out that the spirit may live without the body but the body can't live without the spirit. The soul lives even while sleeping and works without ceasing. He says its nature is to comprehend not incomprehensible things but such things as reason can know and understand. The spirit is the light of reason in the body and when not there, reason cannot do anything but error.

He points out that scripture ascribes many things to these two. Wisdom is ascribed to the spirit and knowledge is ascribed to the soul. The body carries out what the soul knows and the spirit believes.

Thoroughly confused? It would be good to mediate on this as there is a difference. We could probably not really care that much about it as we know we have both soul and spirit and that is enough but I thought you might have questions about each.

The church recently received just such an email, a very official looking Tax Penalty Notice from the IRS. This is a reminder that the IRS and Social Security will **NEVER** communicate officially with you through any means other than a letter through the US Mail. If you receive and open an "official looking" email, **DO NOT** click on any links within the email. If it's supposedly from the IRS, you should forward the entire email to <u>phising@irs.gov</u> to report the scam. If you don't feel comfortable doing that, then simply delete the email.
