FROM THE PASTOR

Luke 12:16-21 And He told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man produced a good crop. He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops. "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of good things laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry." "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?"This is how it will be with anyone who stores up things for himself but is not rich toward God."

You read this passage from Luke about how Jesus handled an inheritance dispute between two brothers. WHEAT RIDGE MINISTRIES

WE RAISE FOUNDATION

Wheat Ridge Ministries began in the early 1900's in Wheat Ridge, CO to deal with the tuberculosis problem facing the country. My family live just around the corner from the buildings built to handle this issue. At one point, my mother was the cook. As the program evolved, a specific TB-centered facility became unnecessary and the hospital was taken over by the county. The Lutheran Hospital is now the main medical establishment for Jefferson County, CO.

In January 2018 Wheat Ridge Ministries (an LCMS connected organization) adopted a new title, their mission changed to new needs. We Raise Foundation seeks to help the poor and disadvantaged thoughout the country. And gift to the entity frees children from the cycle of poverty, violence and inequality. They provide academis intervention, physical care, spiritual nurture through the medium of caring adults. Emerging Leader Grants are provided and gospel-centered organizations.

Any gift to We Raise Foundation will be an uplift to God's glory.
