LENT – THE BODY OF CHRIST

During this 2026 Lenten Season, our theme will be: **The Body of Christ.**

Lent is a season of repentance and renewal, a marvelous opportunity to meditate on our Savior's passion – His suffering and death – so that we might more deeply appreciate His sacrifice that saved us and grow spiritually into a deeper relationship with Christ our Lord.

Feet, hands, mouth, ears, eyes, heart, blood – the body of Christ crucified for our redemption. Christ crucified and resurrected in body and soul is the focal point of our worship and the source of all our spiritual and physical blessings. Without the passion of the Lamb of God, His willingness to sacrifice his own body on the tree of the cross, we would have no share in God's kingdom of grace, the Church, and no spiritual life today and no eternal life in heaven. But thanks to God, Jesus willingly surrendered His body on the cross to purchase our forgiveness and our place in God's everlasting kingdom.

His mouth reminded us that we have a loving and gracious Father in heaven who cares about our every need. His **ears** were tuned to hear the cries for mercy from those who were hurting and in need of the life He came to bring. His **eyes** were open to see their misery and looked to share His compassion. His **heart**, full of compassion and love, again and again prompted Him to use His divine power to heal and comfort people with the forgiveness of sins, even to the point of raising the dead! His blood and body was given in the blessed meal of Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday. His blood was poured out on the cross and His **whole body crucified** on Good Friday for the life of the world. At Easter His disciples celebrated with great joy, **the risen Christ** in body and soul – and we celebrate also!

As members of the body of Christ, won't you come and join us to hear this blessed message of the body of Christ, given into death, to secure your eternal life?

EVANGELISM

Tract of the Month: The Small Catechism by Dr. Martin Luther Pick up a pocket-sized 16-page pamphlet version of the “The Small Catechism” published by CPH St. Louis. Contains The Ten Commandments, The Apostle’s Creed, The Lord’s Prayer, The Sacrament of Holy Baptism, The Office of the Keys and Confession, The Sacrament Of The Altar, and the Morning and Evening Prayers – all with explanations.

Mission for January / February: Ysleta Lutheran Mission Care, El Paso; From their website at <https://ylm.networkforgood.com/projects/66129-mission-programs>: “There is no deeper need than to know the God who created all things and who has addressed the problem of sin, evil, and death. YLM works in partnership with 11 affiliated mission sites/congregations in 13 distinct communities across El Paso and Northern Mexico. Our network of missions and churches exist to bring spiritual healing, by grace in Jesus Christ. Classes, pastoral counseling, hospital visitation, jail visitation, and other services are provided by the congregations affiliated with Ysleta Lutheran Mission Human Care.”

Effective Outreach: The Evangelism Committee recently adopted a 4-part article written by Reverend DRM. Mark Wood that discusses what “Effective Outreach” is and should be, and how to achieve it. With the aid of this and upcoming Trinitarian issues, the committee would like to share what we have learned with the congregation. What follows is an introduction to ‘effective outreach’ within the church.

“What is ‘effective’ outreach? “ Some may think it has to do with numbers, but numbers can be deceiving since numbers alone don’t tell the true story. According to Rev. DRM. Mark Wood, “Effective outreach begins with a good understanding of what outreach is.” He says he finds “that people often confuse *outreach* and *witness*.”

Definitions:

Witness – what individuals do “to share the Good News of Jesus with people in our everyday lives.” Think of this work as the “Church scattered.” (individuals alone)

Outreach – “what we do as a congregation to engage the non-churched people in our community as an organization to make disciples.” Outreach is the work of the ‘Church gathered” (church as a whole).

According to Rev. DRM. Mark Wood, “Effective outreach is the ‘planting and watering’ (cf. 1 Cor 3:5-9) through which a congregation intentionally engages non-churched people in ways that

1. provide the congregation with means of continuing contact with the non-churched people,
2. foster relationship-building between non-churched people and the congregation’s members, and
3. offer appropriate and appealing entry points (other than worship services and traditional Bible studies) that encourage non-churched people to participate in the Word and Sacrament ministry of the congregation.”

In upcoming issues of the Trinitarian, we will explore means and ways to engage in ‘effective outreach’.

Other communication from the Evangelism Committee: The Evangelism Committee will meet again on Monday, February 9th, at 5:30 pm.

BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN



Hopefully you've begun saving your change for those baby bottles for the start of the campaign on January 18th, Sanctity of Life Sunday. In case you don't know much about the campaign, it is a fundraiser for Pregnancy Resources Plus. They offer three main services: pregnancy testing, limited ultrasounds and the building blocks exchange. The Building Blocks Exchange allows expectant parents to take classes on parenting, finance, etc. and earn credits toward baby supplies at the PRP store. They offer Bible studies and classes for post-abortion patients and post-miscarriage patients. All services are provided at no cost. This year funds are being raised to launch a marketing campaign with a new marketing firm. The marketing will be aimed at the younger generation who seem to get their information from social media. You may pick up a baby bottle after church on January 18th for your change and bills. You may also write a check to Southern New Mexico Outreach and place it in the envelope provided on the bulletin board in the narthex. Please do not contribute through our church collections.
