“Chosen”: The next showing of “Chosen” will be November 27th after the church service. Bring a lunch & join us!

Jehovah’s Witnesses: In building the data bank for the Jehovah’s Witnesses responses, it was discovered that all the letters we received came from the same address which we assume to be their church. Regardless, we are going to go ahead with our planned responses to each individual that sent a letter. The following is our first response.

Deuteronomy 18:20-22

“However, the prophet who presumes to speak in my name a word that I have not commanded him to speak or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet must die. And in case you should say in your heart: ‘How shall we know the word that Jehovah has not spoken?’ when the prophet speaks in the name of Jehovah and the word does not occur or come true, that is the word that Jehovah did not speak. With presumptuousness the prophet spoke it. You must not get frightened at him.” (NWT)

True or False: The Watchtower organization self identifies as “The Prophet” speaking in the name of Jehovah. If true, then have their prophecies occurred or come true?

1. The organization predicted that the Battle of Armageddon “will end in A.D. 1914 with the overthrow of earths present rulership” (The Time Is at Hand, 1904 edition p. 101)
2. A further prediction by the organization stated “They are to be resurrected as perfect men & constitute the princes or rulers in the earth, according to his promise... Therefore we may confidently expect that 1925 will mark the return of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and the faithful prophets of old” (Watchtower’s book Millions Now Living Will Never Die, 1920, pp. 89-90).
3. In “Why Are You Looking Forward to 1975?” (title of article in The Watchtower, 8/15/68, p. 494) it was predicted that “The End” would come in 1975.

The 2022 Prayer Service, based on Luke 11:1, "*Lord, Teach us to Pray,*" looks at various forms of prayer used frequently by believers as we seek to honor Christ, the Lord of the Church, with our prayers. LWML thanks Rev. Grimm for authoring the 2022 LWML Prayer Service.

The annual LWML Prayer Service will be **Saturday, November 12 at 10:00 AM.**

Prayer is not female exclusive, neither is this Prayer Service. Men are welcome and encouraged to attend. Light refreshments will be serviced after the service.

THE ORIGIN OF OUR THANKSGIVING HYMN

When we sing the words of the hymn “Now Thank We All Our God,” in church, I wonder how many of us will know the unusual way in which it was used shortly after it was written in Saxony in 1648.

For many years this hymn was sung or recited as a table prayer before meals in households all over Europe. The words were considered a perfect expression of praise and thanksgiving.

Martin Rinkart, a Lutheran pastor, wrote the lines. Shortly after his graduation from the University of Leipzig, he came to a church in Saxony. The Thirty Years’ War was then being fought and he soon came to know its horrors—hunger, starvation, disease and death.

Thousands of refugees poured into the city of Eilenberg but there was not enough room to care for them. Then it was that a terrible fever broke out and before it was over, more than 8,000 persons had died. Mr Rinkart was the only pastor in the whole city so he had the entire burden to carry. He seemed tireless in spirit and worked long hours. It was said that in one year he held burial services for 4,000 persons who died from the fever.

At last relief came, and when the fever was nearly gone, there arose a feeling of thanksgiving in many hearts. The pastor was especially grateful and wrote his thoughts in words of the song we know today as , “NOW THANK WE ALL OUR GOD.”

It was not until the year 1858 that Martin Rinkart’s hymn was translated into English. At that time Catherine Winkworth changed the German words into the lines which are so popular with church-goers in America and England today.

It has often been assumed that the music for this hymn was written by Johann Cruger, but here again Catherine Winkworth is due great credit, for after hunting through old records and searching for the hymn’s musical background, she became convinced that Martin Rinkart, the author of the words. Rinkart had also written the music in 1644. The source of the tune still seems not clearly proven and is still surrounded by mystery.

If you don’t already know this song, wouldn’t you like to learn it this Thanksgiving season? We are giving you the music and the words so if you or any other family member of your family plays the piano, it will be easy for you to learn it. Really sing out as you sing this hymn of praise and thanksgiving to our Savior.

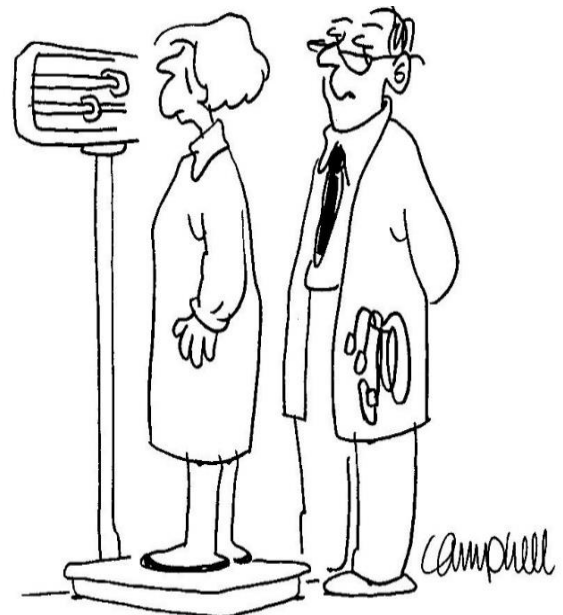
