## FROM THE PASTOR

**“Behold, I send My messenger, and he will prepare the way before Me. And the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to His temple; and the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. Malachi. 3:1**

We understand this verse from Malachi as referring to John the Baptist and Jesus even though it was written 400 years or so before John the Baptist came on the scene. We see John coming to prepare the way for Jesus. How was he doing this preparation? He was baptizing for the forgiveness of sins.

We, in Lent are preparing again for the celebration of Easter, the day Jesus rose from the grave, showing that the Lord God accepted His sacrifice for our sins and the sins of the whole world. Just as the people went to see John at the Jordan to be washed from their sins, we too look at this time of Lent , as a time to prepare ourselves, yes confessing our sins and looking to the one who took our sins upon Himself on the cross so that we could be forgiven.

We take the time of Lent to prepare once again for the celebration of Easter and as we prepare. Jesus is with us, helping us to see our sins but then to show how He is coming in a sense, coming in a few weeks to take those sins and every sin upon Himself, on that cross to make all things new.

With Easter, we think of new clothes that are purchased for the occasion. New outfits are displayed for the first time that day. When I was growing up, feed stores would carry new hatchlings of colored ducks and chicks and there would even be colored baby rabbits appearing there as well. I don't know if it still done today but it was great to see a pink chick or rabbit that would eventually get back to the white that it was supposed to be.

New life, Easter was the day. It is no different for us as we prepare for that day. We look forward to new life even as we have to wait about 9 months for a new human to be exposed to the world outside of the womb. Jesus brought new life to those who were looking to that day.

As we look to Easter of this year, may this time of Lent give us a time to prepare to celebrate as well as to look at ourselves and no matter how dark our sins may be, He has shone a great light that came out of the darkness of the cross, to shine His light of forgiveness on us all.

Take time this Lent to look at yourselves and the dark things about you, all the while preparing to see Jesus, killed on the cross but then risen from the grave to shine His light of forgiveness for you.

### **MISSION SERVICE QUILTERS NEWS: ROADRUNNER REFUGE HOMELESS SHELTER**

The big pile of sheets, pillows, towels, etc. that the LWML collected in the church narthex was delivered to the new Roadrunner Refuge Homeless Shelter, located at 601 Delaware. It's the same building the House of Prayer used when serving the homeless. This Shelter is run by the Pastors from Mountain View Church. The donations were accepted with much gratitude and excitement. They are currently housing 2-10 men a night and will soon open a separate house for women. They told me the quilts like our church's Mission Service Quilters sent are given to their clients, when needed.

The need for sheets, towels, blankets, and personal items is on-going. They also serve a daily meal and are looking for sponsors to provide a meal, possibly once a week. Money is always welcome.

The Quilters here at our church are looking for more hands to help tie and hem quilts. Currently, we are able to complete two quilts a session, but the need is great and we would like to do more. Wouldn't you like to help? We meet on the first and third Thursday's of the month in the Adult Sunday School room from 9:00-10:30 AM. All you need to know is how to tie a knot to be of great help. Half of the quilts we complete will go to LOVE, I.N.C. and half to the homeless shelter.

## WHEN I SURVEY THE WONDROUS CROSS

*But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. Galatians 6:14 (NKJV)*

After Isaac Watts finished his college studies and returned home to Southampton, he wrote many of his now-immortalized hymns for Above Bar Congregational Church. In 1696, Isaac, twenty-two, left home for London to become a tutor.

All the while, he was feeling a clear tug toward ministry. On his twenty-fourth birthday, July 17, 1698, Isaac preached his first sermon. The following year, he became assistant pastor of London's Mark Lane Church.

In March of 1700, Isaac received a long letter from his brother, Enoch, urging him to publish the hymns he had written at Southampton. The letter said.

*Dear Brother, In your last [letter] you [mentioned] an inclination to oblige the world by showing it your hymns in print, and I heartily wish....that you were something more that inclinable thereunto...I am very confident whoever has the happiness of reading your hymns (unless he be either sot or athiest) will have very favorable opinion of their author...There is...a great need of a pen, vigorous and lively as yours, to quicken and revive the dying devotion of the age....Yours now is old truth, stripped of its ragged ornaments, and appears, if we may say so, younger by ages in a new and fashionable dress.*

Isaac, however hesitated. He had other obligations on his time. On March 8, 1702, he became Mark Lane's pastor. The next year, 1703, the church chose Samuel Price of Wales to assist Isaac, due to the latter's fragile health. Under the preaching of these two, the old, dying church revived. The building grew too small for the crowds, and a new house of worship was built down the street.

Finally in 1707, Watts published his hymns, selling the copyright to a Mr. Lawrence, the publisher, for ten pounds. This volume was an instant success. It was enlarged and republished in 1709.

"When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" appeared in his 1707 book of hymns. Inspired by Galatians 6:14, it was originally titled, "Crucifixion to the World, by the Cross of Christ." Many consider it the finest hymn in English church history, and Charles Wesley reportedly said he would rather have written it than all his own.

**MIDWEEK OF LENT 1 (MARCH 1<sup>ST</sup>) –SALT: THE GIFT THAT SWEETENS AND PRESERVES**

You are God's own dear child, baptized, washed, and salted in Christ. This Lenten walk reminds us that Jesus died on Calvary's cross to vaccinate us completely from sin's power and eternal death. Water circulates throughout Scripture to wash, cleanse, flood, and reshape. Like a potter, your heavenly Father remodels you every day, conforming you more closely to the image of His Son, Jesus. As a baptized child of God, you will grow to appreciate through the example of daily washings how rich an inheritance is given to you by the water and the Word in Holy Baptism.

**MIDWEEK OF LENT 3 (MARCH 15<sup>TH</sup>)–LIGHT SHINING IN THE DARKNESS**

Jesus Christ is the light of the world, who enlightens all who believe in Him. His light dispels sin and darkness and fills you with so much light and joy that you truly reflect His light to the world. Although God's Word exposes all your sin (see Hebrews 4:12), in Jesus Christ, you are forgiven. As His baptized child, you now walk as a child of the light (see Ephesians 5:8), reflecting His light to others.

**MIDWEEK OF LENT 4 (MARCH 22<sup>ND</sup>)–BREAD OF LIFE**

Jesus is the true bread of life given by the Father to us. In Him, and only in Him, is life forgiven, meaningful, renewed, and satisfied. Crave and desire the bread of life, Jesus Christ, who the Father has sent to feed the world. In Jesus Christ, you have all that you need every day and for eternal life.

**MIDWEEK OF LENT 5 (MARCH 29<sup>TH</sup>)–PALMS AND VICTORY**

Christians remain joyful and hope-filled even though life circumstances may change. All of God's people remain victorious even amidst pain, adversity, trials, sin, and death. This is why palms are at the forefront for all the people of God. The Christian remains hopeful even when life, trouble, and circumstances declare something opposite. The ultimate victory in Christ encourages all Christians to remain strong even when sin, death, and trial oppose you.
